Second Candle:

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel\* (vs. 5)

O come, thou Key of David, come, and open wide our heavenly home; make safe the way that leads on high, and close the path to misery. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

Third Candle:

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel\* (vs. 3)

O come, O come, great Lord of might, who to thy tribes on Sinai's height in ancient times once gave the law in cloud and majesty and awe. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

Fourth Candle:

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel\* (vs. 7)

O come, Desire of nations, bind All peoples in one heart and mind; bid envy, strife, and discord cease; fill the whole world with heaven's peace. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.
