## English Language Learners

Our ELL program is bustling! We have 100 students registered in six different classes. Not everyone comes every day, but we have used up all the chairs in the Café more than once this semester! Recently, we added a moms' class taught by **Eugenia Fitzgerald** and **Sharon Scott**. We have room for up to 8 moms, and currently average 4 each day.

Vern's Conversation Club on Thursdays has also been a big hit. We have between 16-25 students each week. It has been a good way to incorporate people on our waiting list and help students grow in their ability to speak confidently.

Our semester will end on May 14. At that time, we will say good-bye to many Kazakhs who have been part of our program this year. We will also have summer school beginning June 9—July 23. I am thankful that so many of our teachers are able to continue teaching through the summer. For most of us, the ELL program is part of our strengths and a way for us to change the narrative about immigrants.

Here is a quote from a student who recently left the program.

I got a new job opportunity, and I know this moment was only possible because of the learning and support I received on my English journey. Every coffee conversation, every class, every tip, and every word of encouragement made a huge difference in helping me communicate with more confidence and reach this important goal. Your work goes beyond teaching a language – it changes lives, opens doors, and creates opportunities. It feels like a big family. In every class, I felt the comfort of my Brazilian home, like I was embraced by my own family. So, I want to express my deepest thanks. I will keep learning and carry everything I learned from you with me.

I am so grateful to be part of such an important ministry in our community. Thank you for your support of the ELL program.

## Mission Changes at PCUSA

This past fall, the PCUSA unified the offices of the General Assembly and the Presbyterian Mission Agency. We then heard about the possibility that up to 50% of our mission co-workers would be asked to resign with three months severance pay plus money for each year of service.

At that time, it looked like all our PCUSA mission co-workers might be able to retain their positions. As you can see from the letter we received from the Boyds, all mission co-workers are being dismissed. Some of them will be able to join other ecumenical partners as PCUSA joins with International Ecumenical Liaisons. Financially, PCUSA has been unable to support all our current co-workers and practically, working together with other denominations, strengthens a global church. PCUSA leadership has not let individual churches know these final decisions. We have found out about it from our mission co-workers.

Mark Adams and his wife, Maldonado Escobar are retiring from their border work with Mexico, Bob and Kristi Rice hope to find more mission work in Africa, and Jeff and Christi Boyd are now in early retirement. We pray God will sustain them all in this transition period and continue to bless them and all the important work and people they have impacted throughout these many years.

## From Our Missionaries Jeff & Christi Boyd and Bob & Kristi Rice

Greeting friends and supporters of our service to God's mission through the Presbyterian Church USA.

Many of you have reached out to us asking how we are affected by the reorganization happening as part of the unification of what was once the Office of the General Assembly of the PC(USA) and the Presbyterian Mission Agency. We are very grateful for your prayers and expressions of concern for the impact of changes on our global partners, and for our mission service more personally.

As you may have understood from various news articles, such as the ones noted at the end of this letter,

what used to be Presbyterian World Mission ceases to exist as of March 24, with all mission coworker- and other World Mission staff positions concluding.

That does not mean global engagement will end for the denomination. But it will be restructured and made leaner in order to be financially sustainable moving forward. International Ecumenical Liaisons, initially selected from among the currently serving mission coworkers will be appointed to help guide PC(USA)'s global engagement and to resource presbyteries, congregations and mission networks as you engage with our global partners.

It pains us to let you know that this process has led to our early retirement after 35 years of mission service in Africa. When we met in Pakistan 38 years ago, we sensed a calling to serve the church together. We agreed that, if God entrusted us with children, ensuring their well-being would also be our shared mission.

At critical junctions during our mission service, we have discerned each of these commitments. Our family, including our three children, has been grateful for the opportunity we have had to serve with the PC(USA) since 1990.

As we understand that our service together as a couple does not fit with the new plans of the Interim Unified Agency of the PC(USA), we embrace the joy of new life within the family God has blessed us with. On Friday, March 21, we became grandparents. Our son and daughter-in-law gave birth to their beautiful and healthy daughter, Maddy.

We are deeply grateful for the privilege of having been invited to work alongside global partners and the communities they serve. As we move to the next chapter in our lives, we carry in our hearts and minds a treasure of memories from our many visits, conversations and experiences with church partners in Africa, and with PC(USA) churches, members and friends who kindly hosted us and allowed us to share how we witnessed God at work through ministries run by our church partners.

We appreciate the various ways you have been coming alongside our mission service with PC(USA)'s global partners. Support of the church's global engagement remains important.

As the Presbyterian Church (USA) discerns this new path forward, we encourage you to remain connected and engaged. Please keep an eye open for any relevant articles from Presbyterian News service, starting with those that have already been published.

Dear Mission Team and Friends:

Warm greetings to you in this season of Lent, as we reflect on the suffering, death, and resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. We want to ensure you are aware of some significant changes happening in PC(USA) and for us personally.

This month the work and role of all mission co-workers with PC(USA) is being concluded. PC(USA) is transitioning to a new model of engaging with global partners currently called Global Ecumenical Partnerships. This <u>news article</u> from early February describes more about this significant shift: Any financial support sent to PC(USA) for mission co-workers in the future will go to support continued engagement with global partners in this new model.

For several months we have been preparing to transition from South Sudan. Last week we said farewell to friends and colleagues that we have worked with over 8 years and moved from Juba to the U.S. We will

be discerning over the next several months where God is calling us to continue in ministry, with a hope to return to Africa to serve. We anticipate that we will serve through a different sending agency in this next place of ministry.

We are very grateful to you for your support, prayers, and partnership in this ministry. Your participation in this ministry has enabled us to equip and accompany the church in South Sudan as they train leaders and promote healing and reconciliation. We consider it a gift to be connected with you, and we hope to stay in touch. We would love to hear from you. If you have questions about the new model of PC(USA) or want to discuss our transition or how you can continue supporting us in future ministry, please let us know.

We pray for God's Spirit to continue working in your congregation, to renew your faith and love as you reflect on Jesus' death and resurrection in this season. #### **Financial Update**

#### Contributions

Total February contributions: \$59K from plate and pledge plus \$7.9K from prepaid = \$66.9K This is \$38.6K more than last year and \$1.8K over budget. Total contributions YTD, including prorated prepaid pledges: \$148K which is \$34.4K more than last year and \$17.7K under budget. At 16.7% of the year, we have 29.1% of the budgeted contributions, including all prepaid contributions.

#### Expenses

February expenses were \$83.7K, which is \$20.4K less than last year and \$4.7K over budget. Expenses YTD are \$148.6K, which is \$25.6K less than last year and \$9.4K under budget. At 16.7% of the year, we have spent 15.7% of the budget.

#### **Balance YTD**


Revenue from all sources exceeded expenses by \$83,340 which is \$35.3K more than last year at the same time.





### **Crockpot White Chicken Chili**

#### Equipment

· 6-quart Crock Pot

#### Ingredients

- 1.5 lbs. chicken breasts
- · 15 oz can great northern beans, drained and rinsed
- 4 oz can diced green chiles
- 15 oz tender cactus (drained)
- 1 onion or shallot, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1-1/2 teaspoons cumin
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- big pinch dried oregano
- 2 cups chicken broth
- 1/2 small lime
- 1/4 cup milk, any kind
- · 1 tablespoon flour

• Toppings: green Tabasco sauce, verde sauce, lime wedges, tortilla chips, shredded cheese, chopped cilantro, sour cream

#### Directions

1.Add first 12 ingredients — chicken breasts through lime juice — into a 6-quart crock pot then stir to combine. Cover then cook on LOW for 4 hours or until chicken shreds easily.

2. Remove chicken from crock pot then shred and place in the refrigerator. Whisk flour and milk together in a small dish then drizzle into chili and stir to combine. Cover then cook on high for 30 minutes. Stir shredded chicken back into chili then scoop into bowls and serve with toppings.
