The Dog Days of Summer

Practices of contemplation help us train our gaze to these deeper truths." In this worship series, we will dwell with the God of Divine Goodness, who is deeply in love with us. We will practice ways to return that love as we fall more deeply in love with creation and with one another."

As I prepare for this series, I have found Dr. Farley's book refreshing and helpful in thinking about this idea of God being in love with beauty—not pretty, but beauty. If our eyes spy on the beauty of the creator's world, we are profoundly in touch with our creator. Are you ready to be Beguiled by Beauty? I warmly invite you to join us in worship, either in person or online, beginning August 4th.

Who are your favorite Bible characters?



Financial Update

Contributions

Total June contributions: \$69.8K from plate and pledge plus \$10.3K from prepaid= \$80.1K This is \$20.6K more than last year and \$14.7K over budget. Total contributions YTD, including prorated prepaid pledges: \$443.5 K which is \$7.6 more than last year and \$51.1 K over budget. At 50% of the year, we have 64.4% of the budgeted contributions, including all prepaid contributions.

Expenses

June expenses were \$75.3 K, which is \$19.6K less than last year and \$4.7K under budget. Expenses YTD are \$511.7K which is \$2.7K more than last year and \$31.7K over budget. At 50% of the year, we have spent 53.5% of the budget.

Balance YTD

Revenue, including prepaid, exceeded expenses by \$45.3K, which is \$28.7 more than last year at the same time.


Session Designated Funds


\$1,683,899 which is \$12,309 more than last month.
