Sunday was such a big day for the worship committee.

We began the morning premiering the worship video put together by our editing crew. All of us worshiped at home. We enjoyed the Advent candle liturgy from Gary and Linda, music by our soloists and church musicians. The tech crew made everything seamless.

Following the broadcast, a small crew gathered to record a face-to-face baptism for the next Sunday. Afterwards, they set up for recording more worship, watered poinsettias and vacuumed up leaves, ironed purple tablecloths we are using for ambiance, practiced camera angles, taught a new backup camera operator, and envisioned candlelight and staging around the tree decorated by Ritchie and crew under direction of a PW angel.

Later that evening, expert scene-dressers from local theatre installed directional lights for the Christmas Eve session. Scenes, sight-lines, and lighting for Christmas Eve were tweaked.

Friends, this is just one day in the life of what it takes to do worship for our church community. Our team works hard to bring meaningful worship that is accessible to all. Usually, no more than nine people are in the sanctuary when we shoot services, but another group of nine record batches of music at other times. Special greetings such as the heart-felt Stewardship messages, Advent candle lighting, and special music take more creative effort. Then, behind the scenes saints edit all the parts together.

I've tried not to name these workers because I'm likely to leave someone out. Many hands make for light work. When these hands come together, I see the grace of God at work, and I see the community called "the church" growing in grace.

Financial Update

Contributions

Contributions in November to the Operating Fund were \$6.4K more than in 2019 and \$13.0K below the budget at \$64.5K. The Year to Date total is below last year by \$12.0K and below the budgeted amount by \$70.7K. These figures include prepaid pledges (those paid in the year prior to the budget year) that are prorated over the year with 1/12 added to each month's contributions. Including all revenue sources, at 91.7% through the year, we have received 98.9% of the expected 2020 revenue.

Expenses

Year to Date expenses are \$88.9K below the budget at \$894.1K and less than in 2019 by \$9.0K. At 91.7% through the year we have experienced 83.4% of the expected 2020 expenses.

Balance


Considering all sources, revenue exceeds expenses by \$127.9K which is \$143.6K better than at the end of November in 2019. This figure includes \$134.2K from the Federal Paycheck Protection Program established by the Federal CARES Act.

Restricted Funds


In addition to contributions to the operating fund there was \$23,565 donated in November to funds restricted to specific purposes such as missions supported by our church.


Stewardship

Information About Email Scams



Emails claiming to be from **Pastor Matt** have been received again recently, but please note that these emails are NOT actually from him. Please do not respond to such emails, as they are an attempt by a scammer to get money from you (often in the form of gift cards). If you have already responded, please discontinue the conversation and DO NOT send any money or gift cards. These scammers appeal to our generosity, and can seem legitimate. However, they are not.

The bottom line is this: before purchasing gift cards or some other method of sending money, you should always attempt to contact by a different method the person supposedly sending the email (or phone call, as is sometimes the case). Or, you can check in with the church office to see if we have heard about any such need. It is unfortunate that we have to be leery of such requests for help, but we must do so in order to be able to help when genuinely needed.

You can learn about other email scams (often known as "phishing scams") at https://techservices.illinois. edu/security/phishing. The Federal Trade Commission also provides a helpful page with information about a variety of different scams at https:// www.consumer.ftc.gov/features/scamalerts.

We hope this information will help you to stay safe!

Session Motions Passed at November Meeting



New Students

Recently, 21 new students from Mexico and Guatemala registered for our Zoom classes. All of them are immigrants and most of them are beginner or high-beginner learners of English. This is so exciting for us because, historically, we have had a difficult time getting this population to register and attend classes. We suspect that this has to do with conflicting schedules and lack of access to transportation to get to our classes. With classes on Zoom, we can offer classes at more convenient times. Furthermore, to lessen the burden on these students and make these Zoom classes accessible, the program purchased 10 Chrome Books and will be loaning all of them out to the students who need them to attend class. This population has a great need for improving their English much like our Congolese refugee population. English is a gatekeeper for better job opportunities, access to services, lowered stress levels for living in an English-dominant country, etc. We hope and pray that these classes can open more doors for our students.

ESL Café Time

What? This is a monthly café time on Zoom for the students to see their friends and tutors from all of the classes. It's a chance for them to practice English and interact with Americans who are not their tutor. We will split into small groups so that we can discuss and catch up. First Pres members are invited to join us for the ESL Program's time of fellowship Bring your favorite hot drink and a snack to café time.

Blue Christmas

Will it be a blue Christmas for our Cuban brothers and sisters at our sister church at Luyanó?

The coronavirus pandemic and our government's "maximum pressure" policy for Cuba have created the worst economic depression in three decades. The tiny island, always dependent on imports of fuel, food, medicine and on cash from Cuban American remittances was on its knees even before the pandemic halted its lifeline tourist industry.

Cuba has done well with public health for years. Its government responded with an early and clear message for mitigation including extensive testing, contact tracing, masking and social distancing. A "Cuba Vaccine" is in clinical trials.

The World Health Organization reports 7,700 cases and 131 deaths in Cuba. At the same time the state of Illinois with approximately the same population reports 634,400 cases and 11,300 deaths. Pastor Daniel tells us that none of the congregants at our sister church have been seriously ill. Cuban churches are now meeting in-person. Havana International Airport reopened on November 15.

The Cuban people have long suffered and they are resilient. As they continue in the advent season our Cuban Presbyterian brothers and sisters are grateful and faithful and continue filled

with hope for easier days ahead.

This will not be a blue Christmas for our Cuban friends. We can almost hear them praying Psalm 71:14. "As for me, I will always have hope; I will praise you more and more." May we keep them in our prayers.


Christmas Joy Offering
