You are invited to a "Service for Wholeness" in First Presbyterian Church Sanctuary at 6 PM Sunday evening, July 14.

A "Service for Wholeness" is a quiet worship service where we share words of scripture, song, and prayer focused on spiritual and physical wholeness.

The service is designed for people who are grieving, hurting, or in prayer for others who grieve and are hurting. Some come to these services to pray for a friend and to be in prayer for the world. Some come because the world worries them. Others come with burdens and personal pain.

People are welcome to sit quietly through the service and participate in the singing and praying as they wish. Some will come forward for brief one-on-one prayer with one of the pastors or elders, an anointing of oil, and a prayer.

Scripture strongly affirms ministries of spiritual healing. The root of the word healing in New Testament Greek, sozo, is the same as that of salvation and wholeness. Christian healing is about wholeness--- what the Hebrews knew as shalom. Sickness is not limited to physical illness. Our past experiences of hurt, our sometimes tangled emotions, and our inability to forgive or be forgiven, all make us less than whole and in need of healing. Spiritual healing is God's work of offering balance, harmony, and wholeness of body, mind, spirit, and relationships through confession, forgiveness, and reconciliation. ## **Financial Update**




### Contributions


Contributions in June were \$23K more than in 2018 and \$10K above the budget at \$86K. The Year to Date total is above last year by \$48K and above the budgeted amount by \$5K. These figures include prepaid pledges (those paid in the year prior to the budget year) that are prorated over the year with 1/12 added to each month's contributions. Including all revenue sources, at 50% through the year, we have received 56% of the expected 2019 revenue.

### Expenses

Year to Date expenses are \$8K below the budget at \$523K and \$2K below 2018. Considering all sources, revenue exceeds expenses by \$53K which is \$33K more than at the end of June in 2018. This figure includes \$32K less in prepaid pledges than in 2018. At 50% through the year we have experienced 49.2% of the expected 2019 expenses.








## **Need a Charge**

We recently had a wonderful few days with **Veda Gill** who was visiting with us from the Presbyterian Education Board in Pakistan. She was here to be a part of First Presbyterian's VBS "Near and Far" and stayed for a few days to visit with sponsors of students and the World Mission Committee.

The sponsors had a Monday afternoon tea during which we wrote letters of encouragement to students at Sangla Hill. Veda was able to speak intimately to us about life in Pakistan as a student, a teacher and as a Christian.

We are so grateful for any chance to speak with Veda about ways to support the Sangla Hill School and our sisters and brothers in Pakistan. We have been invited to increase our scholarships to the Sangla Hill students.

Sallie Hutton and Rachel Matthews have a notebook of girls who need sponsors. \$1 a day will support a day student for a year, \$2 a day will support a boarding student for a year. The boarding students are all Christian and we have quite a few of them. The more we can

support students, the more funds will be available for the school curriculum and teachers.

#### **Summer Session**

The First Pres ESL Program is much more relaxed in the summer. Due to public schools also being in summer session, many of our students need to stay home to care for their children. We average about 15 to 20 students a day for summer attendance.

On June 10<sup>th</sup>, we had a guest speaker, **Taylor Bauer**, from *Visit Champaign County*, come and talk about what they do and all the events that occur in Champaign County during the summer. Many of the students and tutors were very interested in what he had to say. Part of the First Pres ESL Program's role is to provide resources to the students including community events in which they can enjoy Champaign and Urbana as well as practice their English.



#### On June 26<sup>th</sup>, **Mark and Kathy Schoeffmann** hosted the annual ESL Summer Picnic at their house. Traditional American picnic food was served like hot dogs and hamburgers, and lawn games were provided for entertainment. Students were encouraged to bring their families, so around 60 people attended the picnic! The students and I are grateful to the

Schoeffmanns for serving us in such a Christ-like way with their hospitality.



#### The Blue Class

The Blue class is our highest level: many students have a high intermediate to advanced level of English. The students in this level often have many questions for the teachers and the conversations they have are very engaging. In this level, many of the students want to get jobs,

volunteer, or go back to school. It is very diverse class with students from all ages and countries. In this particular picture we have students from China, Taiwan, Colombia, Brazil, Russia, Vietnam, and Belarus. Russ Hanegan is the tutor, and he began tutoring with the First Pres ESL Program in Fall 2018. We're always looking for wonderful new tutors like Russ, who have a heart for immigrants and international visitors.

## A Great Earth Care Partnership

#### First Presbyterian Champaign

#### and Faith in Place

Your great Environmental Stewardship Committee has been encouraging First Presbyterian Church of Champaign to take the best possible care of God's gift of the Earth. To do that, they've reached out to partner with Faith in Place, an Illinois nonprofit that works with faith communities of diverse religious traditions to build healthier, more just communities.

As a friend of First Presbyterian and the Central Illinois Outreach Director for Faith in Place, let me tell you a little about how Faith in Place has partnered with FPCC. You can find out more about Faith in Place at <u>www.faithinplace.org</u>.

One of the first things we did together was an energy audit. Faith in Place offers houses of worship a free Energy Audit, which can point to ways to reduce both the church's bills and its contribution to climate change. We found lots of opportunities to capture energy savings!

As **Barbara Fuller-Curry** told us later: Our church is one of the oldest buildings in downtown Champaign and the energy audit made possible by Faith in Place was invaluable for future planning. We cannot thank Faith in Place enough for being such a blessing as we are undergoing major renovation of our buildings at this time. The energy audit will insure our changes will be environmentally friendly.

More recently, we partnered on the Story Garden project, which was so artfully carried out by **Mark and Kathy Schoeffmann** and the Green Team. This project has grown (as we hoped it would) into a more extensive plan to use native plants and pollinator friendly gardens in other areas around the church. These are beautiful and educational areas, where people, young and old, can get to know wild Monarchs and other fascinating species that share our common home.

Faith in Place also works closely with other environmental organizations to organize and send a delegation of faithful citizens to the Illinois state capitol in Springfield to advocate for polices which will protect our Earth. At least a half dozen members of First Presbyterian, and your two pastors, participated in Advocacy Day, meeting with their legislators and speaking from a faith perspective about the importance of protecting our common land, water, and air for future generations.

## Presbyterian Legends in the Pursuit of Peace and Justice

William Henry Sheppard March 8, 1865-November 25, 1927

Presbyterian pastor **William Henry Sheppard** was among the first missionaries to Africa serving in The Congo Free State from 1890 to 1910. Sheppard, an African American from south west Virginia befriended the native Kuba people. When news of the atrocities of Belgian King Leopold reached the United States and Europe, Sheppard used his position in the Presbyterian Church to share his experiences thus becoming a respected civil rights activist. Sheppard returned to the United States after twenty years to pastor Grace Presbyterian Church in Louisville.
