#### The Work of a Transitional Pastor

As I settle into 1st Pres. and Champaign, I am aware of how short my time with you will be, so if it feels like I am moving fast, I am. As one of my seminary professors said of our one-quarter All Church History class, "We will spend very little time smelling the rose as we gallop through history". Transitional work is much the same way. We will be very selective as to which roses we choose to smell, and the rest of our time will feel like a gallop.

So what roses will I smell in the next couple of weeks and what will we be galloping through? I will be spending time with each of the church ministry committees; indeed I have already had the privilege of sitting in on several. I will be breathing deeply as I sit and probably listen more than speak at this time. I am watching, observing, and trying to quickly get a feel for how 1st does "church". Rest assured I will not be this quiet for the rest of my tenure with you. You may look back and wish for these first few weeks in a couple of months. We will gallop through those activities already planned and policies already adopted.

The other task that will take some time will be our first transitional task, to explore your history/ heritage. Edwin Friedman, a family therapist and a rabbi, suggested at a transitional ministry conference that transitions or rites of passage were the original form of therapy. He said that a well-thought-out, deliberate approach to the transitional time can help a congregation deal with the healing of hurts, unfinished business, and missed opportunities from previous days. So, we will talk about past experiences both good and bad in the upcoming weeks in both formal and informal ways (that is dance step 1 if you heard me preach on June 30th). Join us as we work on this first transitional step.

I am settling into a comfortable routine; normally I will be in Champaign from Saturday evening through Thursday afternoon or evening. I will then head back to Indianapolis for my day off on Friday and a bit on Saturday if the schedule allows. Please do not hesitate to drop by the office to say hi when I am in town. For pastoral needs, I would suggest setting up an appointment by calling me at the office. When I am away from Champaign, Pastor Joe and others will help



# **The Heart of Mission**

## July Raindrop Offering to Support Mission Aviation Fellowship

After several of Matt's Friday emailers, many of you may realize that our church's Raindrop Offering is coming up in July and that this year's Raindrop offering will be going to Mission Aviation Fellowship- United States. Historically, this offering is called a raindrop offering because we have raindrops with different prices on them and you can choose a raindrop of your choice at a certain price. This is hard to do with services located downstairs this year. However, listed at the end of this article, you will note various prices for some of the services provided by MAF.

Mission Aviation Fellowship is celebrating its 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year. If you recall our own Presbyterian Disaster Assistance program which was part of our One Great Hour of Sharing also is celebrating its 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary. This is not a coincidence. Both programs are an outgrowth of a desire for peace, an understanding that we are all connected in our world, and a desire to help others in need, wherever they may be found.

In 1947, World War II pilots in the U.S. and the U.K, initiated the development of Mission Aviation Fellowship. (The very first pilot to fly on a mission was a WWII woman pilot, **Betty Greene**, flying two missionaries to a jungle area of Mexico.) These pilots were able to purchase a few small planes and began flying to small, isolated, hard to

reach communities in Africa and South America to share the word of God with others.

MAF has evolved over the years and has various components. It is a family of organizations led by people in countries around the world who have a similar vision of taking Christ's love into the most remote places on earth. MAF-US collaborates with sister organizations to meet spiritual and physical needs in 37 different countries. Collectively, the fleet of 135 airplanes serves some 1,500 non-profits, churches, and humanitarian organizations. Every 5.6 minutes a MAF aircraft takes off or lands somewhere in the world, transporting people who live in remote communities, and assisting aid and development agencies, missions, and churches to share the love of God.

MAF-U.S. has service locations in 12 countries, sharing God's love through aviation. They overcome geographic, political and religious barriers, aiding in medical care, educational opportunities, clean water, community development, and the gospel of Christ. MAF-U.S. also serves 4 restricted access countries. Each year, MAF-US serves more than 400 non-profit, local, and mission organizations all over the world with aviation, communications, and learning technology services.

MAF-US headquarters in Nampa, Idaho is where our mission co-workers, **Kent and Nancy Contrucci** have been working for 9 years after serving 8 years in Papua, Indonesia where Kent was a MAF pilot. At MAF headquarters, Kent has just completed his calling as a safety specialist in the aviation safety department, teaching

pilots from around the world how to service and fix their own planes on location. During COVID, Kent was able to complete a manual that is able to be used for zoom presentations.

Over the years, MAF has learned from those they meet and has seen lives transformed by the service ministry of MAF.

#### **Financial Update**

#### Contributions

Total May contributions: \$37.9K from plate and pledge plus \$10.3K from prepaid= \$48.2K This is \$14.4K less than last year and \$17.2K under budget.

Total contributions YTD, including prorated prepaid pledges: \$ 363.4 K which is \$13K less than last year and \$36.4 K over budget.

At 41.7% of the year, we have 55.5% of the budgeted contributions, including all prepaid contributions.

#### **Expenses**

May expenses were \$115.5 K, which is \$32.8 K more than last year and \$35.5K over budget. Expenses YTD are \$436.4K which is \$22.3K more than last year and \$36.4K over budget. At 41.7% of the year, we have spent 45.5% of the budget.

#### **Balance YTD**


Revenue, including prepaid, exceeded expenses by \$31.4K, which is \$26.7K less than last year at the same time.


#### **Session Designated Funds**


\$1,671,590 which is \$57,184 more than last month.
