

Demographics

Cuba's African culture evolved as a mechanism of existential survival and adaptation for the African men and women that experienced slavery, dehumanization, and racism on the island. Today, African influence is seen in many aspects of Cuban culture, from foods made with yams and plantains, to

words like "bachata".


By the 1550s, the indigenous Taíno and Siboney (Ciboney) Taíno population was largely depleted during the Spanish occupation of Cuba. Today, Taíno culture is most fully preserved in La Caridad de los Indios, nestled high in the Sierra del Cristal mountains overlooking Guantánamo.

Many white Cubans trace their ancestry to waves of migration from Spain that started in the 18th century. A significant number migrated to the US in 1959 following the revolution led by Fidel Castro, settling mainly in South Florida. Some settled in Puerto Rico.

Financial Update

Contributions

Total April contributions: \$75K from plate and pledge plus \$7.9K from prepaid= \$82.9K This is \$18.8K more than last year and \$17.8K over budget. Total contributions YTD, including prorated prepaid pledges: \$ 304.1 K which is \$11.1K less than last year and \$43.7K over budget. At 33% of the year, we have 47% of the budgeted contributions, including all prepaid contributions.

Expenses

April expenses were \$84.2 K, which is \$12.8K more than last year and \$5.2K over budget. Expenses YTD are \$317.9K, which is \$2.9K less than last year and \$1.9K over budget. At 33% of the year, we have spent 33.6% of the budget.

Balance YTD

Revenue from all sources exceeded expenses by \$79.8K which is \$26.2K less than last year at the same time.

Session Designated Funds






