We knew where to stand on the board, pull the sail up, and balance ourselves while turning. All this preparation was essential for us to be ready to sail. Being comfortable with what we were doing began with this preparation and, of course, having a great sail from start to finish.

Stewardship, like windsurfing, is a journey that starts with understanding. It's not about guilt or obligation; it's about discovering the joy in giving and reaching our true capacity for generosity. Starting from a place of wonder and awe opens the door to finding delight and satisfaction in sharing and in our practice of stewardship.

Stewardship is not about us; it's about God. It's about recognizing that we respond to God's actions, not trying to earn God's favor. God has already blessed and provided for us, and our role as faithful stewards is to acknowledge and honor God's gifts.

First Presbyterian is a blessed congregation. This year's stewardship season begins on November 10. It is a shortened two-week period during which you will receive one mailer (with a pledge card) and several moments of stewardship focusing on abundant joy and overflowing generosity. This year, we will examine what your generosity provides as a percentage of our budget.

Did you know that 40% of our budget for next year supports worshiping God? Wow! That speaks volumes about where we believe First Presbyterian's priorities lie. We allocate 32% of our budget to maintaining our historic building, which is probably unsurprising. Additionally, 14% is designated for local and global missions, reinforcing our beliefs. The rest of our budget is divided among spiritual formation, outreach, and congregational connections.

When I look at our 2025 budget, I see a church that clearly understands who they are and whose they are. WOW! Praise God, who gives us joy and inspires us with overflowing generosity.

First Presbyterian Church *Historical Interviews, 1998-1999*

First Presbyterian Church of Champaign collected interviews with several long-term members of the congregation twenty-five years ago.

At the time, plans were in progress to recognize the establishment of the Church, in 1850, with special "Celebrate 150" worship services, social gatherings, and a history book. With the help of many people writing, editing, and gathering information, *Heritage, Vision, and Mission* was published in 2005.

This booklet contains the early drafts of interviews which were transcribed from cassette tapes.

Some of the memories appeared in the book while others were omitted for space and narrative demands.

These transcripts, typed on a typewriter, are rough, but legible. The church is making them available at cost to members and friends. We may one day park these historical documents on the church webpage, as we believe the history (and love) they capture are worth preserving.

Enjoy reading these glimpses of informal Church history from old friends.

Some Good Reading from Joe Lundy

The Cross and the Lynching Tree by James Cone - This is a powerful book linking the death of Christ to the history of lynching in the U.S. that also asks why we have avoided this connection. A good read, but it can be a bit tough.

Financial Update

Contributions

Total September contributions: \$49K from plate and pledge plus \$10.3K from prepaid= \$59.3K. This is \$0.9K less than last year and \$6.1K under budget. Total contributions YTD, including prorated prepaid pledges: \$576.6 K which is \$37.9K less than last year and \$12K under budget. At 75% of the year, we have 77.4% of the budgeted contributions, including all prepaid contributions.

Expenses

September expenses were \$76.5 K, which is \$4.1K less than last year and \$3.5K under budget. Expenses YTD are \$728.8K, which is \$11.5K more than last year and \$8.8K over budget. At 75% of the year, we have spent 76% of the budget.

Balance YTD


Expenses exceeded revenue from all sources by \$60.7K, which is \$46.8K more than last year at the same time.


Session Designated Funds


\$1,438,186 which is \$313,153 less than last month.
