Pray for the Cuban people suffering the worst food shortage in 25 years, for the Cuban pastors and sessions delivering pastoral care during this time of medication shortage and isolation due to the coronavirus, for pediatric services in the hospital at Mantanzas overwhelmed with cases of children with Covid and the Matanzas seminary which is housing some of these sick children, for the passage of bipartisan legislation currently in Washington that would open up exports to Cuba again, that the Cuba Partner Network container shipment with supplies of beans, rice, powdered milk, detergent and syringes be shipped soon to Cuba, and for the PCUSA search committee interviewing candidates for the Presbyterian World Mission Latin America Area Coordinator.
