


The Heart of Mission August 31, 2021

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance

In the last month we have had added several disasters to the many that the PC(USA) Presbyterian Disaster Assistance fund is already assisting: the earthquake in Haiti, flooding in Tennessee, Hurricane Eta, and, the most recent, Hurricane Ida. In Haiti the earthquake has left almost 1300 people dead and thousands more injured and missing, 13000 homes destroyed and transportation and communication arteries destroyed.

This morning the news alternated between the scenes from Hurricane Ida and the evacuations from Afghanistan. We are fortunate that our local mission partner, The Refugee Center, is already working with our Afghani neighbors. The PC(USA) does not do its mission work alone; it works in partnership with people already on the ground. The PDA is a first responder in these disasters.

With regards to Haiti, "Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is providing emergency relief and short-term recovery in the impacted areas through our established local partners and in collaboration with ACT Alliance and its members. The PC(USA), through PDA and together with

regional World Mission colleagues, will remain active throughout the entire recovery process, accompanying our partners in the area as they determine long-term program needs and providing financial support for rebuilding and resilience."

If you are interested or decide to volunteer, please let me know. I want to determine if First Presbyterian can take a day or afternoon a week as a church. This is what Cheryl, the new Center coordinator wrote me,

The Phoenix serves as an important intersectional space in our community where people from different walks of life who don't usually interact have the opportunity to get to know and understand and bless one another. We would love it if you would come and be a part of this community with us!

We are open Tuesday-Friday 12-5, and we're looking for people to spend time with our friends without addresses--chatting, playing games, doing puzzles, etc. There are two ways your church members could volunteer their time. The first way is to volunteer individually (ideally, we'd like people to come for 2-3 hours shifts, but we're flexible). If this is something your members would be interested in, please have them contact me directly, and I will get them scheduled for a volunteer slot! Another possibility that we've utilized in the past is to have a church commit to covering one day a week for us. We generally ask for 3-5 volunteers during all of our open hours, and you can decide how you'd like to cover that time--you can split up the shifts however works best for your volunteers. If you are interested in this, please let me know (and we would be SO grateful!), and we will work out the details.

We want to keep our mission partners in our prayers, those who are waiting to go back to their place of ministry and those who are able to work where they are. Listen for God's call to you in their ministry.
