

# The Heart of Mission November 9, 2021



We have terrific news! We celebrate with our hermanamientos in Cuba. Many of you Cuba Partners already received this news but I had to share it with everyone. Read through to the bottom for more mission news.

Several months ago, CPN received a request from the IPRC for a container of commodities to be shipped to Cuba. CPN members Laura St. Clair (*coordinator*), Rev. John Potter (*CPN Co-convener*), Barbara D'Andrea (*Program Committee*), and Rev. Valdir França (*PC(USA) Regional Coordinator for Latin America*) served on the CPN Cuba Container Committee, and set to work on logistics.

Rev. Izett Samá (General Secretary, IPRC Havana Presbytery) was designated by the IPRC as coordinator in Cuba and a humanitarian aid cargo management company, *Missionary Expeditors*, was contracted to help us navigate the world of international shipping.

After countless WhatsApp meetings with the IPRC, a list of items to ship, as well as a budget for the items, was approved. A container was assembled which included rice, beans, powdered milk, coffee, soap, detergent and syringes.

Last month, after delays due to both hurricanes and red tape, our container was shipped from the port of New Orleans to the port of Mariel in western Cuba.

We are overjoyed to share that the container was recently received by the IPRC and they have begun distribution to presbyteries and churches!
