In the past couple of years, the Community Mission Deacons have sent Angel Tree gifts to the staff of our local mission agencies. This year, Community Mission Deacons voted to support our own Presbytery's mission agency that cares for foster children and orphans in our region. We have received information about ten children who will not be spending Christmas at home with their families this year but will be at Kemmerer Village.

We have hung ornaments on the tree that will have practical as well as wish list items from these specific children which Kemmerer Village has given us information about. The tree will be up this Sunday November 21 so you will have the Thanksgiving week to begin shopping for them.

Once you purchase the gifts named on your ornament, you can bring them back to the church November 28-December 12. December12th is absolutely the very last collection day as Rachel will be driving the gifts to Kemmerer Village the morning of December 13th.

The gifts need to be unwrapped and put in a plastic bag along with the ornament you have taken from the tree. You can attach (taped or tied) the ornament to the plastic bag with the gift inside.

If you do not wish to shop but wish to donate money for a deacon to purchase the gift or donate for a Camp Carew scholarship, please bring it to the church office so Rachel can shop or assign a deacon to shop for the gift before the day they must be delivered.

If you know you would like to participate, but will not be present to take a wish list item from the tree tags, just let Rachel or Mindy know and we will set one aside for you and email you the information from the tag.

Thank you ahead of time for bringing joy to these children.



Advent Offering 2021 -

The Advent Offering begins November 28 on the first Sunday of Advent and will be taken up each of the four Sundays in Advent. Typically we do not have special envelopes in the pews available, but ask you to write "Advent Offering" in the memo of your check or on the front of a regular offering envelope, along with their name if donating cash. You can also give online and put in the memo "For Advent Offering." The Community Mission deacons have chosen the destination of the offering this year. The offering will go to The Refugee Center to assist the 6 Afghan families that have been evacuated to our area. We want to welcome them to their new home. At the end of December, we will send the full amount collected to The Refugee Center.



Spiritual Formation invites us to prepare our hearts and minds for the birth of Christ. Let's spend the season looking at the ordinary and glimpsing the divine. Advent in Plain Sight by Jill Duffield is the book (available to purchase at \$15 beginning Nov. 21). The study will happen every Sunday in December at 10:15 in Mae Chapin Parlor.

December 2, Presbyterian Women Christmas Tea – 12 noon.
